1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms used have the meanings shown:

- Health related qualifying degree: A program equivalent to AQF level 7 or 8 recognised by Griffith Health and specified in Schedule A for the purpose of admission into the Griffith University Doctor of Medicine only.
- Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC): QTAC acts on behalf of the University to process admissions
- Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC): VTAC acts on behalf of the University to process admissions into the Doctor of Medicine only.

2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Through admission, the University seeks to provide access to persons from diverse backgrounds so that the student cohort reflects the diversity in the wider community. The University has approved entry pathways for the admission of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander: First Peoples into the Doctor of

Medicine as specified in Schedule A and selected Griffith undergraduate Health programs as specified in Schedule B.

3. **ELIGIBILITY**

A guota of places available to applicants of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent is determined annually by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Education). Applicants for these places are required to provide confirmation of Aboriginality with their application. As defined by the Commonwealth Parliament as someone who:

- is of Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent;
- ii. identifies as an Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person; and
- is accepted as such by the community in which they live or have lived. iii.

4. SELECTION CRITERIA

Applicants will be assessed on the basis of their academic achievement, in addition to their participation in an:

assessment of cultural, social support and academic needs interview (representatives from GUMURRII Student Success Unit, the office of the Pro Vice Chancellor (Indigenous) and the relevant Griffith Health School and/or program)

The admission criteria for the Doctor of Medicine is further specified in Schedule A and for each identified Griffith undergraduate Health program in Schedule B.

5. **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Applications are to be submitted via QTAC for undergraduate programs.

Doctor of Medicine applications are submitted via the Graduate Entry Medical School Admissions System (GEMSAS) operated by VTAC. In addition to the requirements in Section 4, the following requirements also need to be met:

- Identify as Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander (refer Section 3).
- Personal resume, including referees, evidence of achievements and experience.
- Brief statement outlining reasons for wanting to study in their chosen field of education.

6. **REVIEW AND APPEALS**

The review and appeals process is outlined in the Student Review and Appeals Policy and the Student Review and Appeals Procedures. Further information can also be found here.

SCHEDULE A: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander First Peoples Admission Criteria for the Doctor of Medicine only

Applicants applying for the Doctor of Medicine* with a Griffith Health related qualifying degree as listed below in this schedule (Schedule A) are not required to complete any additional admission related tests but are required to meet the following criteria:

Students must have completed or be in the final year of completing a Griffith health related qualifying degree as detailed below with a GPA of 5.0 or above on a 7 point scale using the approved admission schedule.

Criteria for applicants with any other degree NOT listed in this schedule (from Griffith University or another university)

Applicants applying with a qualifying degree not listed below in schedule A are not required to complete Griffith University Multiple Station Admissions Assessment (GUMSAA), but are required to complete Graduate Medical Schools Admission Test (GAMSAT), as well as meet the following criteria:

- GAMSAT score of at least 50 (minimum of 50 in each subsection)
- Must have completed or be in the final year of completing a qualifying degree with a GPA 5.0 or above on a 7 point scale using the approved admission schedule.

*The Doctor of Medicine is an AQF Level 9 extended Masters program.
