We seek to do this through establishing a continuing bi-national presence that encourages and supports collaboration within and between medical schools in Australia and Aotearoa/New Zealand and by building linkages with the community and other health education sectors.

The LIME Network recognises and supports the primacy of Indigenous leadership and knowledge.

The LIME Network is hosted by the Melbourne Medical School, Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences at the University of Melbourne.

LIME Network receives funding from the Australian Government Department of Health

LIME Network is a program of Medical Deans Australia and New Zealand.

LIMECONNECTIONX

The tenth biennial Leaders in Indigenous Medical Education (LIME) Network LIMECONNECTIONX will be held in Canberra, Australia in 2023. The event will be hosted by The Australian National University on Ngunnawal Country.

The conference encourages strengths-based presentations related to

- Indigenous health learning and teaching
- Curriculum development and research related to Indigenous health
- Community engagement with Indigenous health education
- The recruitment and graduation of Indigenous students in the health professions.

LIMECONNECTIONX provides an opportunity for:

- Collaboration, information sharing and networking across nations
- Professional development and capacity-building
- Linking with community, colleges and those from all health disciplines
- Discussion and critique of current practices
- Exploration of emerging tools and techniques to drive improvement in Indigenous health

LIMECONNECTIONX provides the space for robust discussion and an opportunity to celebrate successes and share new and evidenced-based approaches in the discipline.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible to apply for the **LIMECONNECTIONX** Māori Medical Student Bursaries, candidates must:

- have whakapapa (Māori ancestry);
- be a current student enrolled in medical studies at a New Zealand University;
- be of good standing
- Have no assessment or placement requirements at the time of the conference (22nd to 25th October 2023), or during the time of travel to and from the conference.
- Have the support of the LIME Reference Group member at their medical school (<https://limenetwork.net.au/about-us/our-people/>)
- be a financial member or agree to register as a financial member of Te Ohu Rata O Aotearoa (Te ORA) - Māori Medical Practitioners Association; and
- agree to presenting their LIME Connection Conference report at the Te ORA Hui-a-Tau where possible.

SELECTION CRITERIA

This selection is not based on academic achievement.

Bursaries will be awarded on the recommendation of a selection committee and will be based on the following criteria:

- Interest in Māori health and medical education
- An interest in improving Māori health
- Letter of support from LIME Reference Group member
- Applicant meets the eligibility criteria, and the terms and conditions outlined below

Students who have submitted successful abstracts to present at LIME Connection will be considered first for bursary places.

APPLICATION PROCESS

You must submit:

1. An application form
2. A personal statement of up to one A4 page in support of your application. Your personal statement may address any, none or all of the following, or be personal statement you feel will aid the Selection Committee:
 - How the attendance at **LIMECONNECTIONX** will assist you with
 - Your program of study
 - Your personal and/or professional development
 - Your interest in Māori health
 - Interest in medical education
 - Your future aspirations
 - Your ideas about the place of medicine in modern healthcare provision for priority populations
3. A signed statement (and accompanying form) from the LIME Network Reference Group member at your university (please see Attachment 1 for a list of LIME Reference Group members).

APPLICATION DUE DATE

Medical Student Bursary applications are due **May 15, 2023**

Applicants will be notified of their application outcome by **mid-June 2023**

SELECTION PROCESS

The LIME Connection Bursary Committee will consider each candidate's application against the eligibility and selection criteria.

The Committee's decision will be final.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- All successful applicants must satisfy the Medical Student Bursary eligibility criteria (see p.3).
- The award of the LIME Connection Student Bursary is conditional on the successful applicant agreeing to provide a brief post-conference report to Te ORA and the LIME Network by **December 2023**.
- The award of the LIME Connection Student Bursary is conditional on the successful applicant agreeing to attend conference proceedings.
- Delegates must be present at the conference proceedings and attend all sessions for the duration of the conference.
- Delegates must attend the Cultural Day on Sunday 22 October 2023 (organised and paid for by the LIME Network).
- Flights and accommodation will be organised, booked, and paid for by the LIME Network.
- Successful applicants will be accommodated in standard rooms.
- Flight and accommodation bookings are final and cannot be adjusted unless in special circumstances.
- Successful applicants must confirm their acceptance of the bursary by **12 July 2023**.
- In the case of cancellation, your bursary is not transferable to another medical students. Please confirm your acceptance of the bursary only when you are sure they will be able to attend.
- You must inform LIME Network of cancellations due to illness or similar as soon as possible.
- Flights and accommodation will be organised so that bursary recipients arrive in Canberra on **Saturday 21 October and leave on Wednesday 25 October 2023**. If successful applicants wish to stay in Canberra for longer (at their own cost). LIME Network will work with you to try and organise flights on different days. You will need to communicate clearly and in a timely way.
- No reimbursements will be issued for flights, accommodation or other items paid for by the bursary recipients themselves. All relevant payments must be made by the LIME Network.
- Bursary recipients must hold a valid passport if international travel is required.

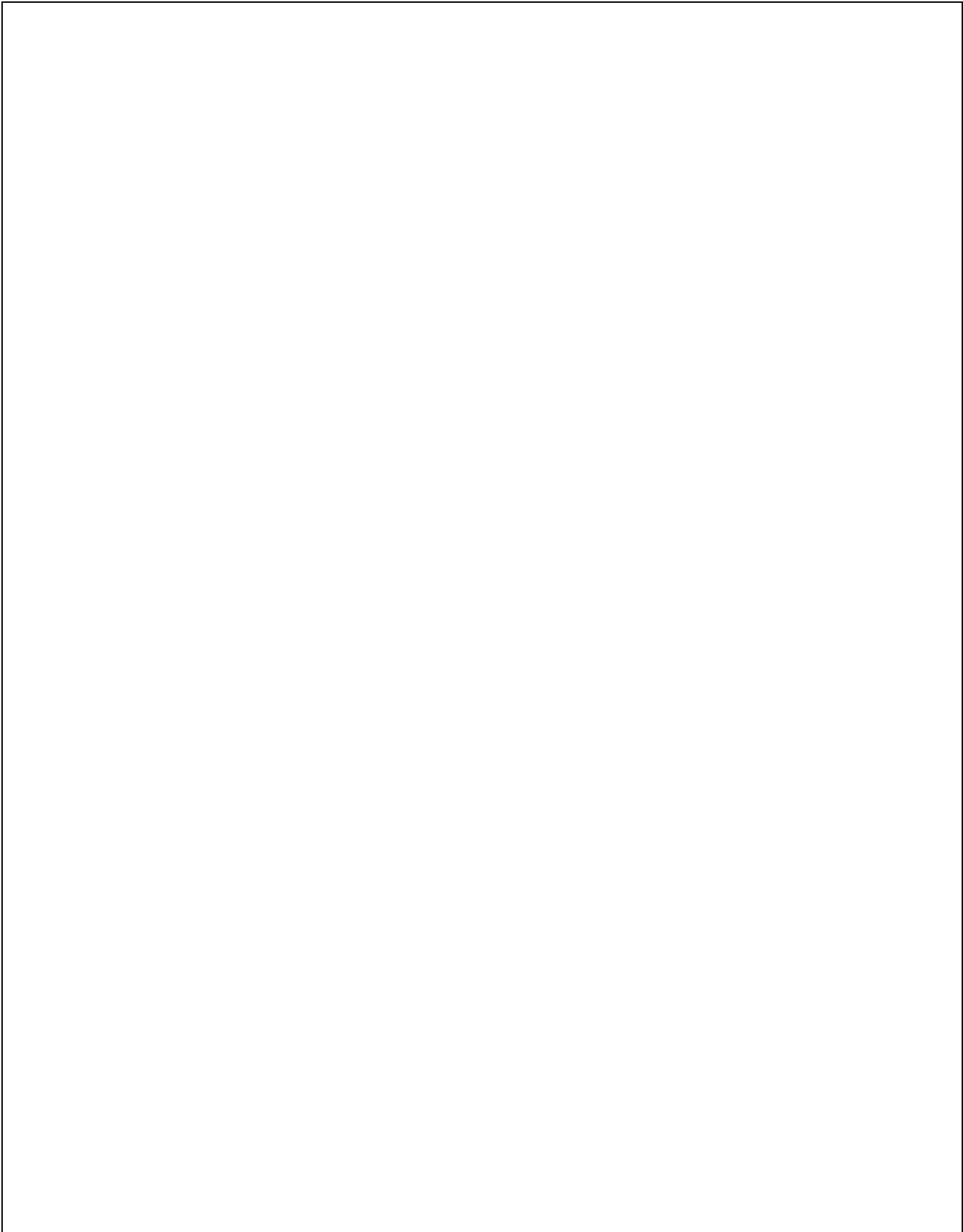
